**Two** M. Graham Clark Awards may be presented. **One award** is given to a Missouri Teacher who teaches at the Elementary School Level. **One award** is given to a Missouri Teacher who teaches at either the middle school or high school level.

Both of these award winners will be the guests of the MOSSAR at the April State Meeting.

The Middle School/High School winner will be submitted to the National SAR committee to be considered for the Tom & Betty Lawrence NATIONAL teacher award. Elementary teachers are not eligible for this award.
